Swimming Coach

Key responsibilities

- Planning and preparing of sessions for short and long-term development in accordance with the Roseville College Swimming
 program manuals and guidance of the Head of Swimming.
- Assist in all levels of the swimming program as needed by the Head of Swimming.
- Deliver technically appropriate sessions that run on time and involve all participants enrolled in the program.
- Facilitating the skill development of swimmers with a range of skill levels to achieve performance outcomes.
- Monitor attendance of all levels of squads, whilst providing feedback to parents on their children's progress and development when required.
- Keep abreast of changing rules, techniques, technologies, and philosophies relevant to swimming.
- When required attend school carnivals and swimming meets, including IPSHA and/or IGSA.
- Support Roseville College Swimming activities, including holiday camps and relay organisation.
- Tailor the learning experience to meet the individual needs of each student.
- Set up and pack up equipment required to deliver sessions.
- Provide a safe and encouraging environment for all students.
- Attend staff training sessions.
- Undertake lifeguard and pool attendant duties for both squad programs and PDHPE lessons as required.
- Maintain positive interactions with students, parents / guardians, and fellow staff.
- Perform other duties as required.

Child Safety

- Uphold the highest standard of child safety culture and awareness.
- Report all concerns regarding the safety of our students to the Principal or their delegate, in accordance with the College's child protection policies.
- Develop and maintain a thorough understanding of child protection obligations by reviewing the College's child protection policies and completing mandatory induction and ongoing training.

- Implementation of technical stroke correction and teaching proficiency within a structured swimming program from LTS to competitive squads.
- Development and implementation of a holistic swimming program with swimmers of variable age and level.
- Elite level experience as a swimming competitor highly desirable.
