

# **Additional Charges Guidelines**

In addition to School and Camp Fees set out on the annual Fee Schedule, the College charges additional charges. Additional charges cover the cost of cocurricular activities and other items based on a 'user-pays' principle. These charges will be unique to each student based on her participation in various cocurricular or optional activities, ensuring that families only pay for things related to their daughter's participation.

It is important to note that these additional charges are made at cost, and not with the goal of generating surplus for the College. These costs will be advised to families at the point of registration or commitment to the activity.

Additional charges will be made for the following types of items and activities:

#### 1. COCURRICULAR SPORT PARTICIPATION - IGSA/IPSHA

Students who sign up for sport will be billed at a flat rate per term that goes towards sports registration fees, ground hire, sports coaches, bus transport and other costs. This charge will be charged in advance wherever possible.

Students are asked to register for sport in advance and resources are allocated on this basis. Students who withdraw in week 3 or later will not be eligible for a refund or credit as the College will have already registered them with IGSA/IPSHA and organised coaching rosters accordingly. Students who withdraw after registering but before the beginning of week 3 are able to contact the College for a credit on their next term's account. An administration fee of \$50 will be deducted from any credits processed.

Over 2025, the College will be moving to charging sports costs in advance on registration.

## 2. COCURRICULAR SPORT PARTICIPATION - OTHER SPORTS

The College is moving towards charging all sports costs in advance on registration wherever possible.

### 2.1. Learn to Swim and Squad Programs

Learn to swim and squad programs will be charged in advance on registration. Fees applicable to these activities cover staffing, equipment and pool costs.

## 2.2. Rowing

Rowing is a high-cost sport involving facilities, equipment, water access, and a high coach to student ratio. The College attempts to keep rowing charges as low as possible, while still making this sport accessible for families.

#### 2.3. Gymnastics, Dance and Fitness

Gymnastics, Dance and Fitness are charged to cover specialist staffing and where applicable, competition costs.

#### 2.4. Snowsports

Snowsports charges are calculated to cover lift fees, equipment hire, uniform, instructors fees and accommodation where applicable.

#### 3. COCURRICULAR DEBATING

Debating charges cover the cost of coaches and competition entry fees.

#### 4. COCURRICULAR MUSIC ENSEMBLES

Participation in Music Ensembles is charged separately twice a year, on Term 2 and Term 4 invoices. Music Ensembles charges cover the cost of specialised staffing.

#### 5. INDIVIDUAL MUSIC TUITION

Individual music tuition at Roseville College is charged directly to families by the music tutor. The College does not charge families on termly school fee invoices for individual music tuition.

#### ANY OTHER COCURRICULAR ACTIVITIES THAT INVOLVE ADDITIONAL COST TO THE COLLEGE.

All other cocurricular activities are analysed for whether they involve additional costs to the College. If they do, then they will be charged to participating students.

Where a charge is involved, this will be advised as part of the registration process.

## 7. EXCURSIONS THAT ARE OVERNIGHT AND/OR OUTSIDE THE SYDNEY METROPOLITAN AREA

Due to the extra cost incurred in long-distance and overnight excursions, these are charged to families as additional charges, even where the excursion is compulsory.

## 8. EDUCATIONAL DIGITAL SUBSCRIPTIONS

Educational digital subscriptions for Senior School students are listed on their booklists each year. These subscriptions are supplied and supported by the College.

Junior School students will be charged for any educational digital subscriptions that are provided on their College devices.

#### 9. EDUCATIONAL RESOURCES

Additional resources (eg. art kits) for Senior School students are listed on their booklists each year.

#### 10. HIRE OF COLLEGE PROPERTY

Hire fees and a bond will be charged for the hire of any College property, such as musical instruments.



## 11. JUNIOR SCHOOL LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT OR CHALLENGE DAY PROGRAMS

Non-curriculum related leadership development or challenge day activities for Years 5 and 6 will be charged separately to cover the cost of these activities.
